

NON-SURGICAL ISOLATION GOWNS

STAY FOCUSED ON PROVIDING ATTENTIVE PATIENT CARE



HOW THE PROGRAM WORKS

1. Scheduled arrival of isolation gowns to your facility.
2. SSR loads carts with ready-to-laundry gowns onto truck for return to Cintas laundry facility.
3. At Cintas facility, gowns are washed and dried separately from other textiles.
4. Gowns are bundled, poly-bagged and scanned for washed life history. Gowns that meet the manufacturer's recommended life cycle are removed and destroyed.
5. Gown bundles are loaded on a cart for transport back to customer site.



DAMAGED GOWNS

If you find a damaged gown that needs repaired or replaced, you can simply put your gown in an orange repair bag and place it in the soiled gown hamper. If there are no bags present, please let your Cintas service representative know and they will be happy to supply more at the facility.
